A family charitable trust committed to supporting local charities in Colchester is benefiting from a Government Challenge to raise more money for Essex. The donation which was received by the Milsom Charitable Fund from Pridmore's Bookmakers has increased by 50% thanks to the Grassroots Grants and Endowment Match Challenge in Essex.

Shaun Pridmore presented the cheque to Paul Milsom, Managing Director of Milsom Hotels. Paul said, "The Milsom family has a long association with Pridmore's who have run many successful race day events at Le Talbooth. For the first time, we agreed between us, that profits from this year's events would be donated to our Charitable Fund." He added "At least customers who backed the wrong horses can have some satisfaction knowing that their money will support good causes in Essex!"

The donation of £3,045 was increased to £4,567 thanks to the Grassroots Endowment Challenge for Essex which is managed by local grantmaking trust, Essex Community Foundation.

Pridmore's Bookmakers is a family business, established in 1930, and with betting shops throughout Essex and the South East of England.

Paul's father Gerald, who died in 2005, was a great supporter of charitable activity so following his death, Paul and his wife Geraldine established The Milsom Charitable Fund to carry on Gerald's legacy.

The Grassroots Grants Challenge is a Government funded programme designed to encourage local individuals and businesses to help build long-term endowed funds for their communities. As well as making £2 million available to award in small grants to grassroots groups across Essex, Southend and Thurrock, the Government will match every donation that is received by Essex Community Foundation from individuals and businesses.

For every £2 raised, the Government will add £1. The aim is to build a £5 million fund by March 2011 which will provide sustainable financial support for local charitable groups and projects.

There are 1000's of charities and voluntary groups working for the community to create a richer society for all. Community Foundations build endowed funds and make grants to these organisations.

- There are 55 local Community Foundations in the UK covering 94% of the population

- Collectively they manage endowed funds of circa £200 million
- In 2006/07 Community Foundations distributed grants totalling £75million.

Grassroots Grants

Grassroots Grants, funded by Office of the Third Sector (OTS) and administered by the Community Development Foundation (CDF), recognises the vital contribution these 'grassroots groups' make to improving our communities.

Over three years, Grassroots Grants will support the sector in building stronger, more active communities with two complementary approaches. An £80 million grants programme will make small grants available to grassroots groups across England. An innovative £50 million endowments match challenge will enable local funders to raise donations on a matched basis and invest them to sustain grassroots funding into the future.
