The High Sheriff of Essex, Rupert Gosling, is inviting local community groups, young people and volunteers to apply to the High Sheriffs' Awards Scheme for recognition and grants.

There are two parts to the High Sheriffs' Awards Scheme:

- Grants of up to £1000 are available to voluntary and community groups that are working to make their local communities safer places to live and work.
- Recognition will be given to volunteers who have made an outstanding contribution in their local community, making it a safer place.

The deadline date for applications is 1 December.

The High Sheriff said "It is a great honour to be the Queen's representative for Law and Order in the County". He added "There are so many people in Essex who are giving an enormous amount of time helping to keep Essex communities safe from crime. The Awards ceremony provides a great opportunity for their valuable contribution to be recognised".

Local grantmaking trust, Essex Community Foundation administers the Awards Scheme, working with local Community Safety Officers and local Volunteer Centres. An independent panel of judges, chaired by the High Sheriff and including past High Sheriffs, will agree the Awards which will be presented by the High Sheriff at a special event on 10 March 2010 at the Fennes Estate, Bocking.

The **deadline** date for completed applications to the High Sheriffs' Awards is **1 December**. Essex Community Foundation was set up in 1996 and has established a grants programme which has seen around 3,500 Essex based charities and community groups receive over £14 million in grants. Funds are distributed on behalf of a wide range of donors who want their charitable giving to be accessible to local charities. www.essexcommunityfoundation.org.uk

Community Foundations are independent charities committed to supporting projects that engage local people. Since the 1980s, a nationwide network of Community Foundations has developed, endorsed by many major public figures and leading companies.

There are 1000's of charities and voluntary groups working for the community to create a richer society for all. Community Foundations build endowed funds and make grants to these organisations.

- There are 55 local Community Foundations in the UK covering 94% of the population
- Collectively they manage endowed funds of circa £200 million
- In 2006/07 Community Foundations distributed grants totalling £75million.

The High Sheriffs' Fund has been managed by Essex Community Foundation since 1997. Since then 317 grants have been awarded to voluntary and community groups totalling £220,460.
